Old Business

1. Current status of request for demolition – former Catholic Church in Stoney Point.
 - Administration went over the history of the application, request to demolish the church, committee reviewed and advised that a Historical Assessment to address any components that should be saved should be undertaken. The assessment was not taken. The owner may be interested in bringing this application forward again.

New Business

1. Review of the Municipal Heritage “Listed” properties.

Section 27 of the Ontario Heritage Act gives municipalities the authority to maintain and add to a publicly accessible heritage register.

The register includes a list of all designated properties, including conservation districts within the municipality.

In addition, the register may also contain 'Listed' properties – those that are not designated, but are believed to be of cultural heritage value or interest.

- Administration went over the list, explained that we would like the Committee to help to prepare a 1 to 2 page summary for each property regarding the historical significance. Looking for some rationale or explanation as to why these properties were added to the list which will assist Planning and Building in inquiries regarding these properties.

Action(s)

- Administration will research and advise the Committee of the cost of. Asked how much a typical Heritage Assessment costs
 - Committee members to consider how to tackle this list – by communities (e.g. Comber) versus site specific properties.
 - Bring Forward – June meeting.
2. Administration has received a request from an individual who is doing ancestry research, and would like some assistance.

“Looking for descendants of Joseph Reaume, who donated land for the first cemetery in 1825.”

- The Committee suggested that the Cemetery record keeper might have this information. Also mentioned that the Belle River/Emeryville Historical Facebook group may have some additional information.
