Traffic:



Other Policing Priorities:


- Develop transfer of care protocols with healthcare facilities







Essex








- A 7.6% increase in Calls for Service September 2021 compared to September 2020 (E-tickets not included)




<u>Violent Crime</u>⁴



- A 10.3% decrease in Violent Crime September 2021 compared to September 2020. Clearance Rate = 64.0%
- YTD a 14.0% decrease in Violent Crime in 2021 (333 occurrences) compared to 2020 (387 occurrences)

Property Crime⁵




- A 21.7% increase in Property Crime in September 2021 compared to September 2020. Clearance Rate = 17.7%

Motor Vehicle Collisions⁶



- A 29.5% increase in MVCs September 2021 compared to September 2020
- In September 2021, 25.6% of all collisions were diverted to the Collision Reporting Centre.
- YTD, Collisions are 0.3% higher in 2021 (1,270 collisions) compared to 2020 (1,227 collisions)






Administrative Drivers Licence Suspensions (ADLS)⁹






- ADLS suspensions are the same in September 2021 compared to September 2020






Provincial Offences 12

Traffic Stops 13




- A 35.2% decrease in recorded traffic stops in September 2021 compared to September 2020

Notable Investigations

| Lakeshore | Officers responded to a call in which the call-taker could hear a female say "help me, I don't want to die" while another female could be heard saying "don't come, please don't come." The call was disconnected and multiple ring-backs were not answered. Subscriber information eventually placed the call to an address where officers found two teenagers and a female adult bleeding from her hand. The female stated her husband had stabbed her in the hand and fled upstairs. Containment was established and K9 Maximus was successful in locating the male hiding on the property. The 48 yr. old male was found to be experiencing a mental health crisis and subsequently apprehended under the Mental Health Act. |

| Kingsville | The owner of a greenhouse was alerted by his security system of an intruder. The owner was able to observe a lone male walking around the tool room from a remote camera system. Officers arrived on scene and located an open door. After a short foot chase, officers apprehended a 22 yr. old male. A search incident to arrest revealed the male had property belonging to a neighbouring green house as well. The male was subsequently charged with Break & Enter commit Theft, Possession of Property Obtained by Crime and Possession of Break In Instruments. |
| Tecumseh | In July 2020 officers were dispatched to a gas station for the report of a fraud. The store clerk received a fraudulent \$50 bill from a female to purchase lottery tickets. Over the following days and weeks, the same suspect attended 13 different businesses and uttered (or attempted to utter) fake \$50 bills. Investigation revealed the driver's licence presented at one of the stores had been stolen from the Peel Region. The suspect's rental vehicle was also found to have been reported stolen from the GTA. Video evidence and considerable follow-up, resulted in the accused being identified as the 27 yr. old daughter of the person who had rented the vehicle and failed to return it. That female is charged with Utter Counterfeit, Possess Counterfeit, Personation with Intent, Possession of an Identity Document and remains Wanted. |
| | Multiple patrol officers, ERT, K9 and aviation services responded to a 3-day search involving a missing suicidal male. The male was located deceased by self-inflicted means. |
| Essex | A 37 yr. old male has been charged with Personation with Intent, Use/Deal/Acts on Forged Document and Possess Property Obtained by Crime after attempting to sell a stolen vehicle to an auto-wrecker. The male handed over the vehicle and plate portions of the vehicle and signed over the documents presenting himself as the owner. |
