Detachment Focus and Priorities

The OPP's action planning process ensures compliance with the Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services Regulation (Adequacy Standards) filed as O. Reg. 3/99 in 1999.

Through assessment, analysis and consultation, the following areas of focus were identified for the next three years (2020 – 2022) in Essex County:

Crime:

- Reduce victimization from instances of sexual violence
- Address & prevent property crime
- Address & prevent illicit drug crime
- Support victims of domestic abuse
- Address the proliferation of illegal grow operations

Traffic:

- Year-round focus on causal factors of motor vehicle collisions with a focus on (Big 4) Aggressive Driving, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving and Use of Seatbelts
- Marine enforcement and security on local waterways
- Streamline collision reporting

Other Policing Priorities:

- Develop transfer of care protocols with healthcare facilities
- Identify co-response solutions for non-police-related demands for service

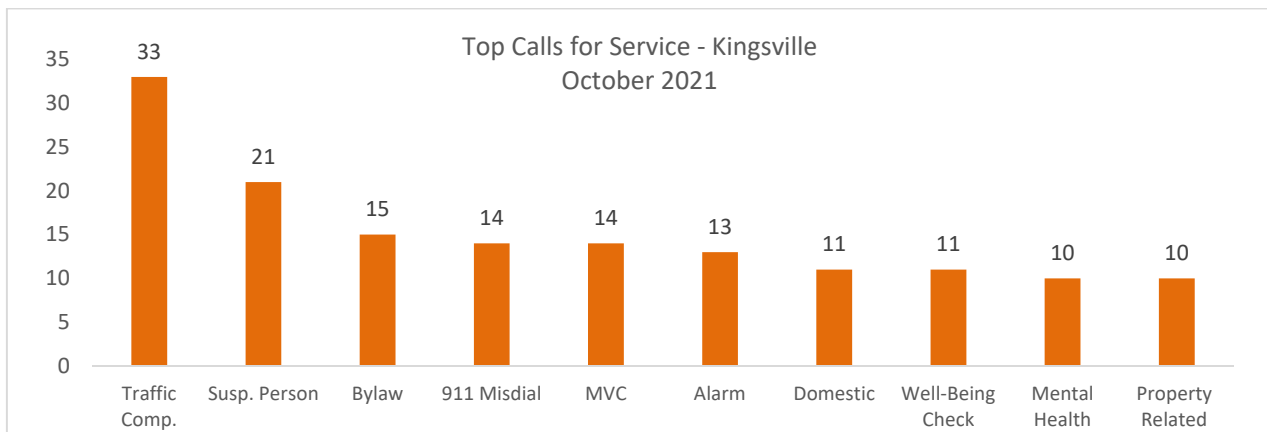

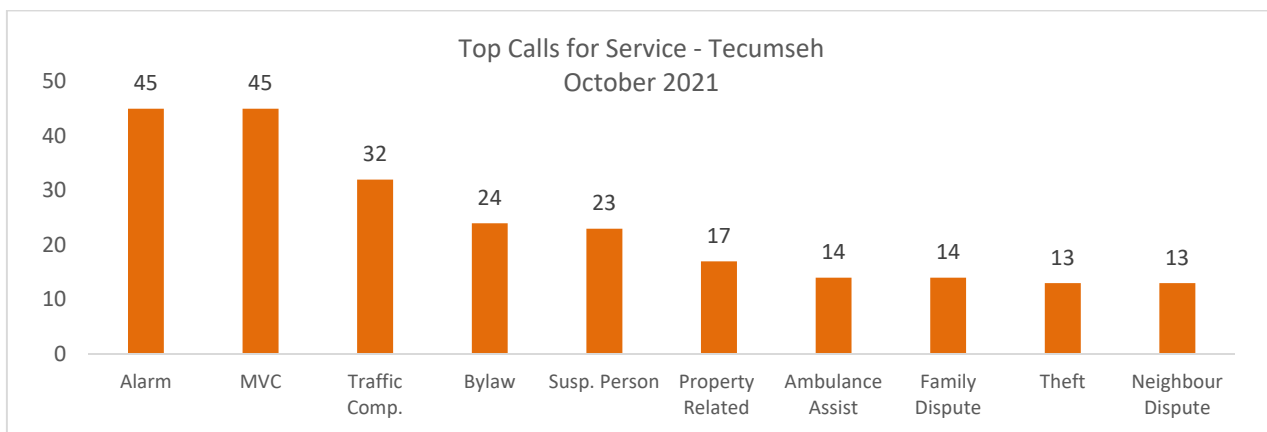

Essex



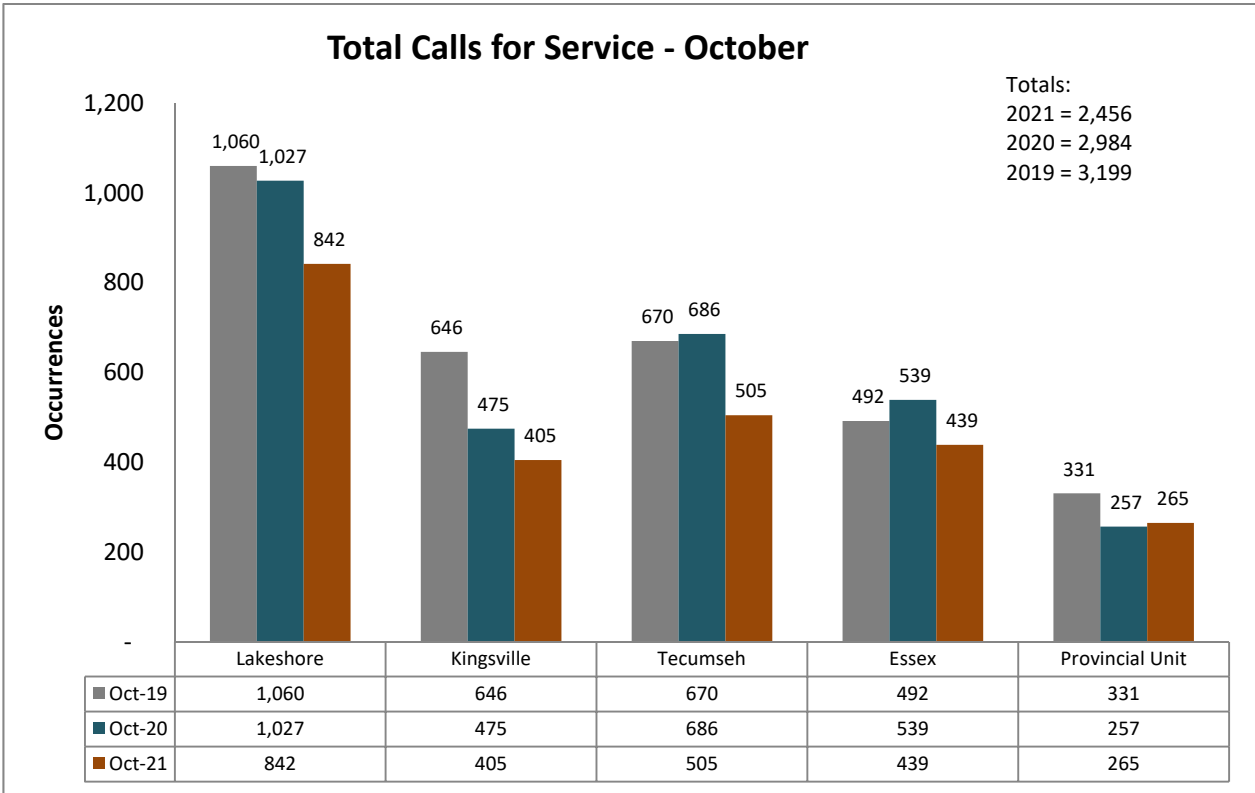

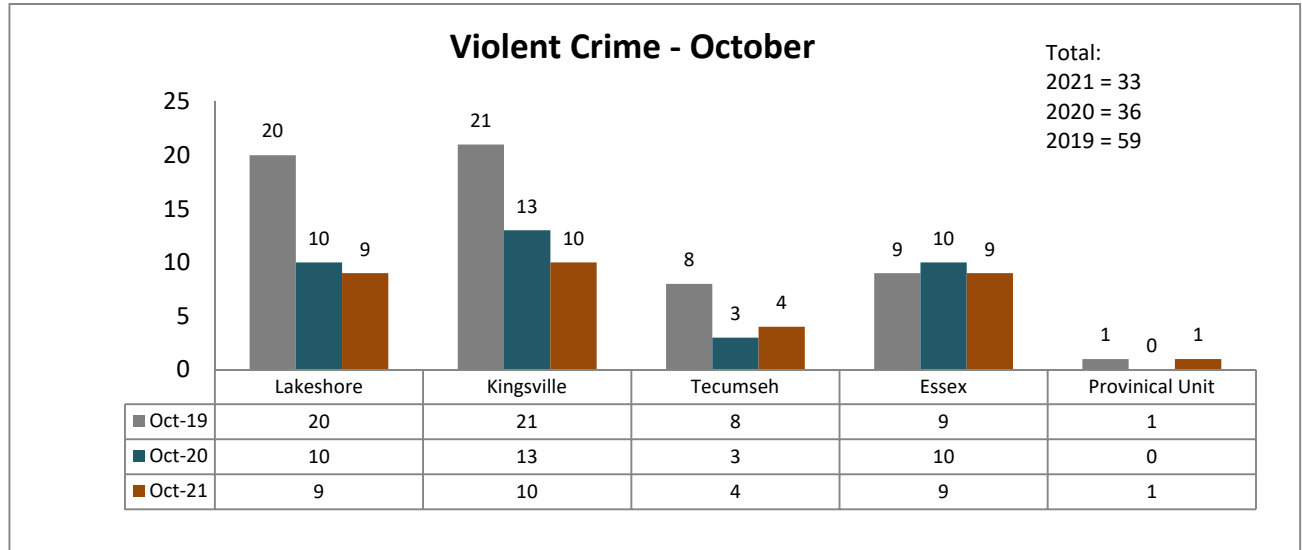


- **A 17.7% decrease** in Calls for Service October 2021 compared to October 2020 (E-tickets not included)
- YTD a 10.4% increase in Calls in 2021 (25,537) compared to 2020 (23,124)

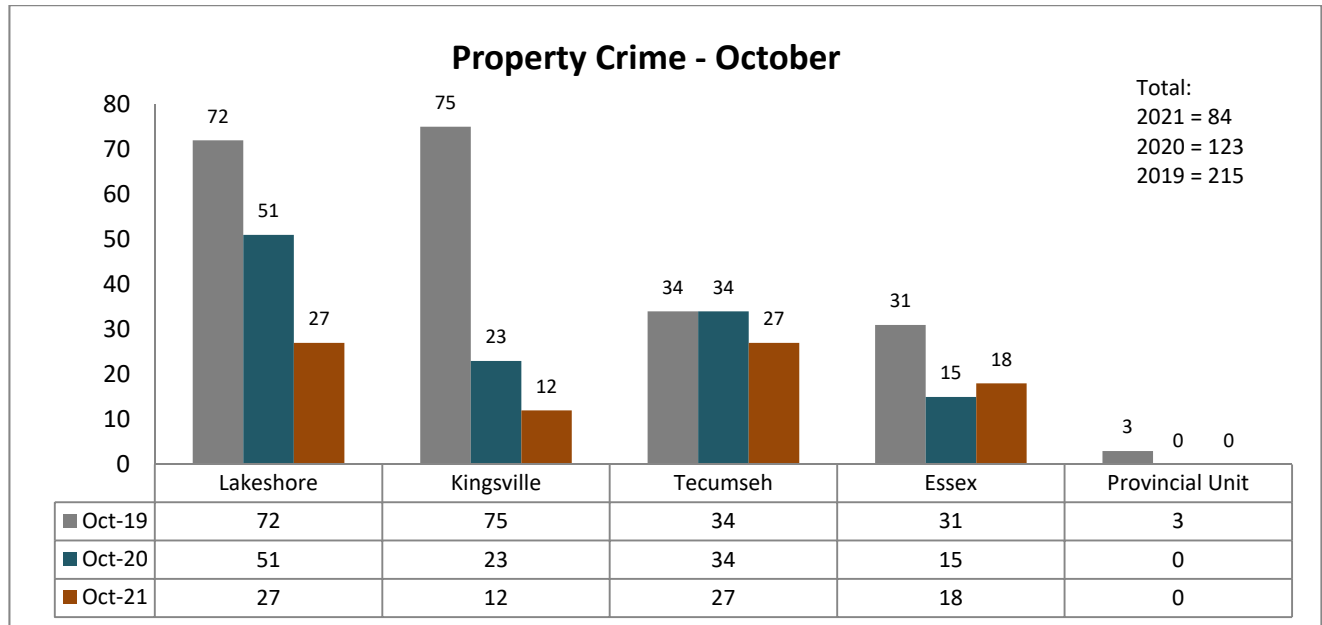


Violent Crime⁴



- An **8.3% decrease** in Violent Crime October 2021 compared to October 2020. **Clearance Rate = 72.2%**
- YTD a 13.5% decrease in Violent Crime in 2021 (366 occurrences) compared to 2020 (427 occurrences)

Property Crime⁵



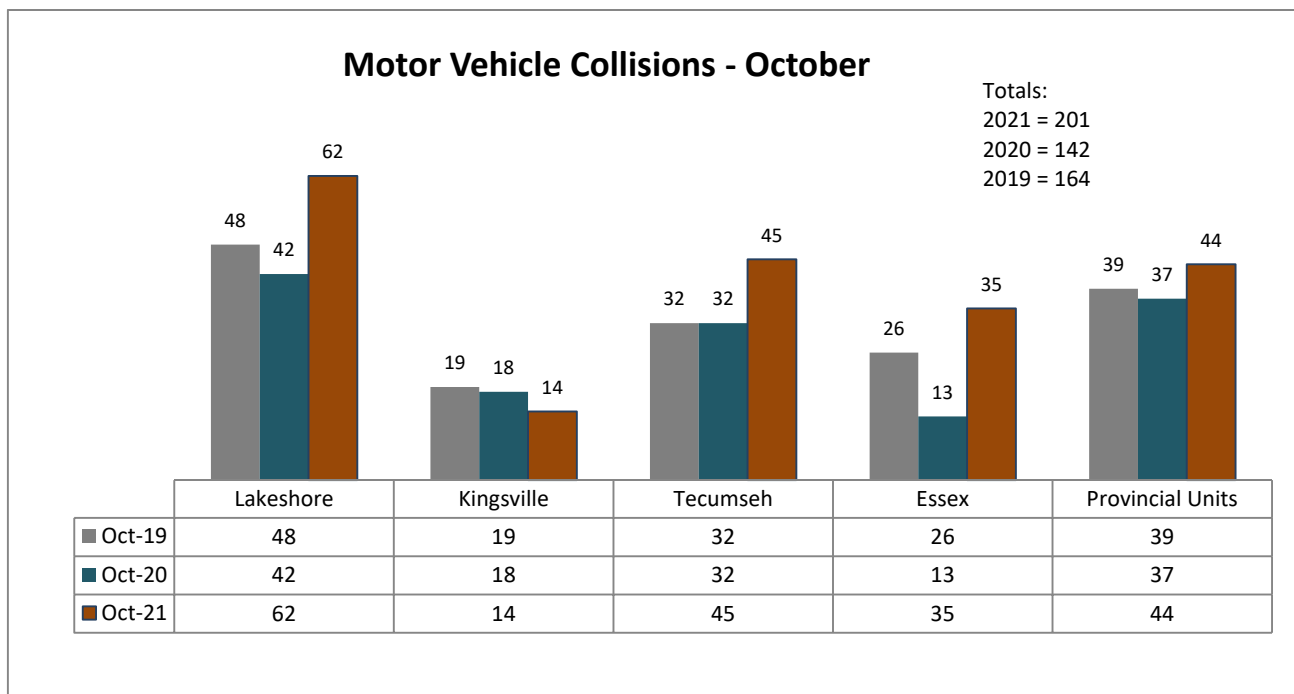
- A **31.7% decrease** in Property Crime in October 2021 compared to October 2020. **Clearance Rate = 17.9%**
- YTD Property Crime is 19.3% lower in 2021 (1,170 occurrences) compared to 2020 (1,450 occurrences)

Motor Vehicle Collisions⁶



- A **41.5% increase** in MVCs October 2021 compared to October 2020
- In October 2021, 35.8% of all collisions were diverted to the Collision Reporting Centre.
- YTD, Collisions are 7.6% higher in 2021 (1,469 collisions) compared to 2020 (1,365 collisions)

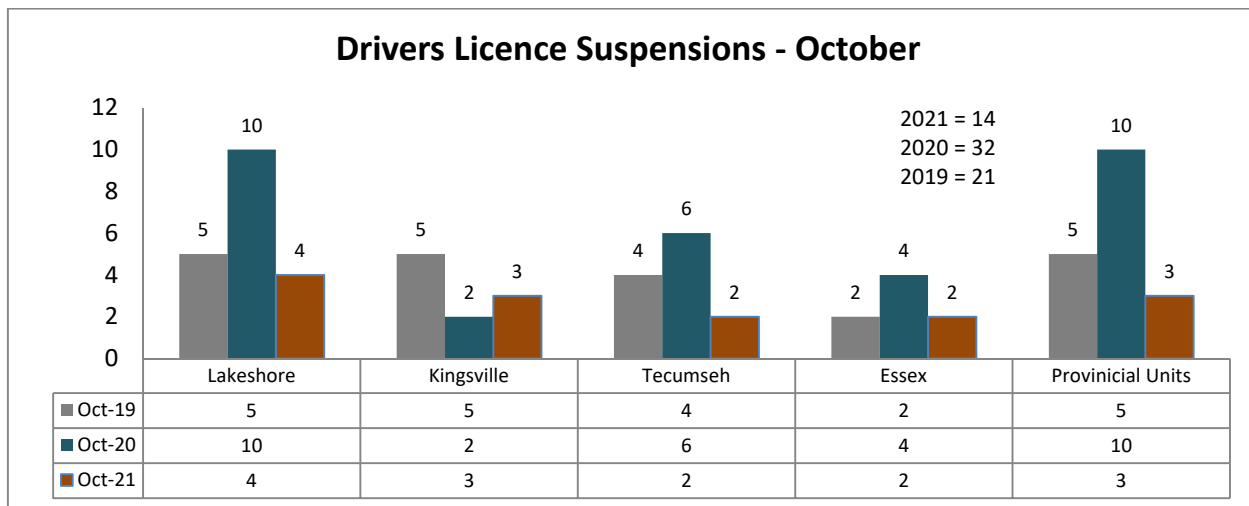
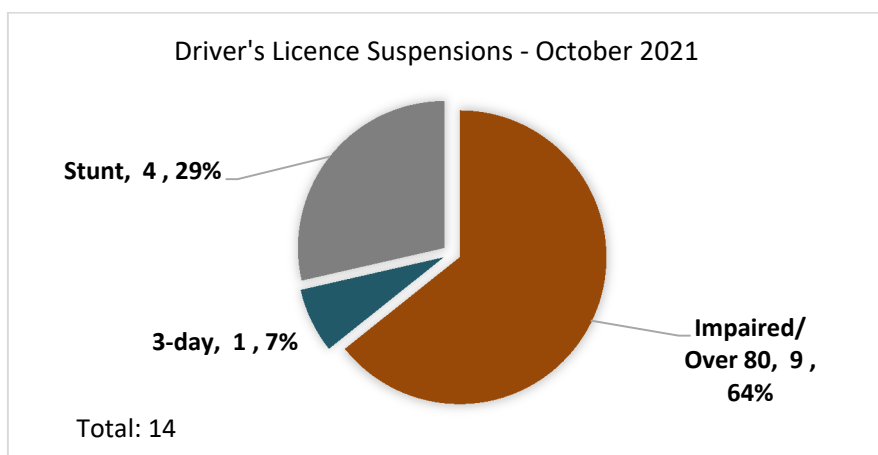

Administrative Drivers Licence Suspensions (ADLS)⁹



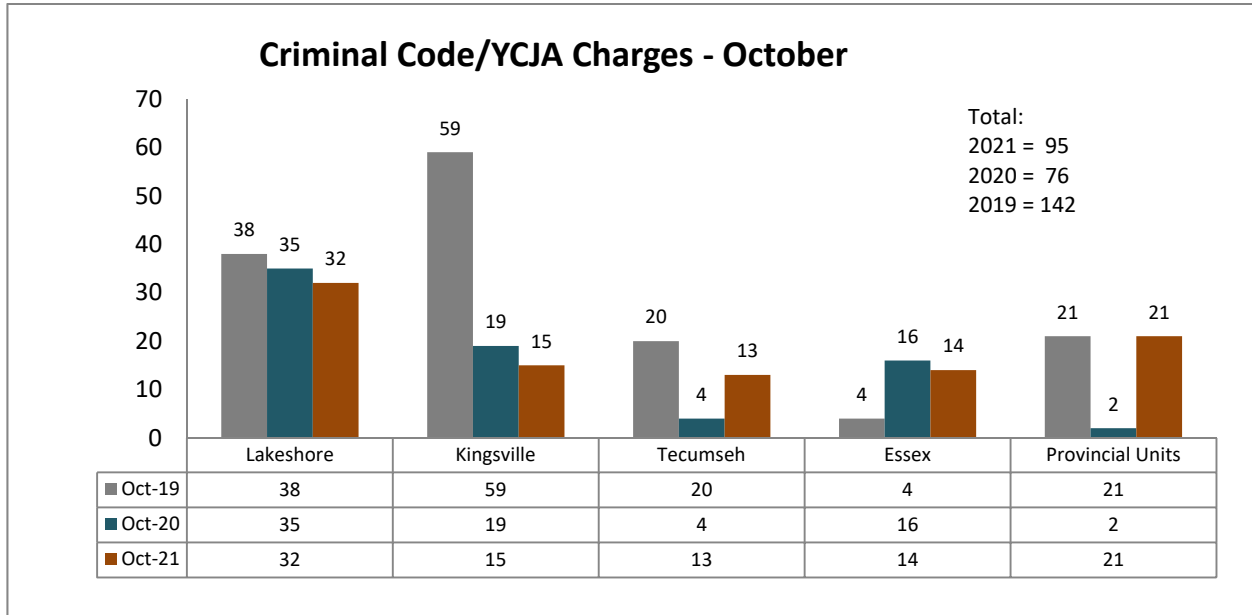
- A **56.3% decrease** in ADLS suspensions in October 2021 compared to October 2020
- YTD, ADLS suspensions are 30.4% lower in 2021 (176 suspensions) compared to 2020 (253 suspensions)

- An **25.0% decrease** in Criminal Code charges in October 2021 compared to October 2020
- YTD, charges are 7.7% lower in 2021 (1,047 charges) compared to 2020 (1,134 charges)

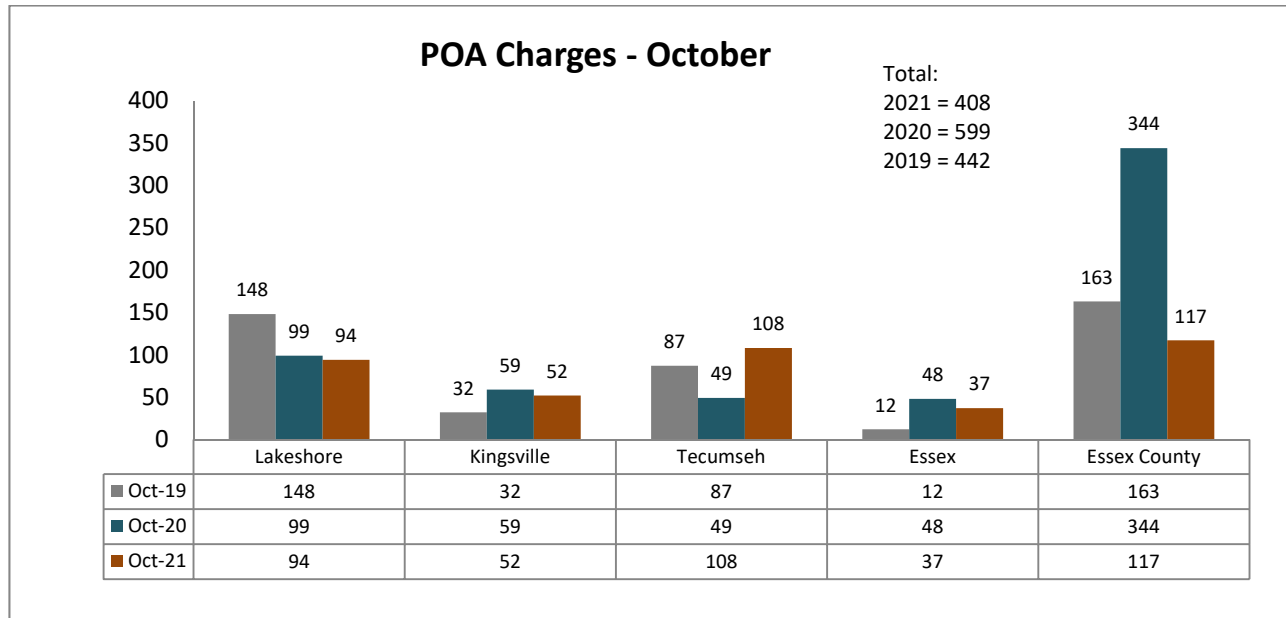
- A **71.4% decrease** in Drug Offences in October 2021 compared to October 2020

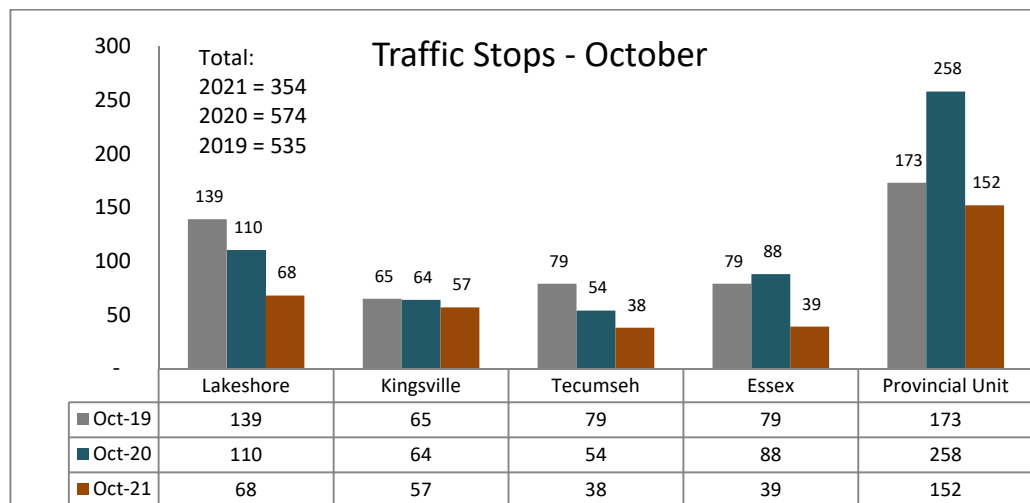


Provincial Offences¹²



- A **31.9% decrease** in provincial offences October 2021 compared to October 2020
- An average of **13.2 tickets/day** (compared to 19.35 tickets/day in October 2020)

Traffic Stops¹³



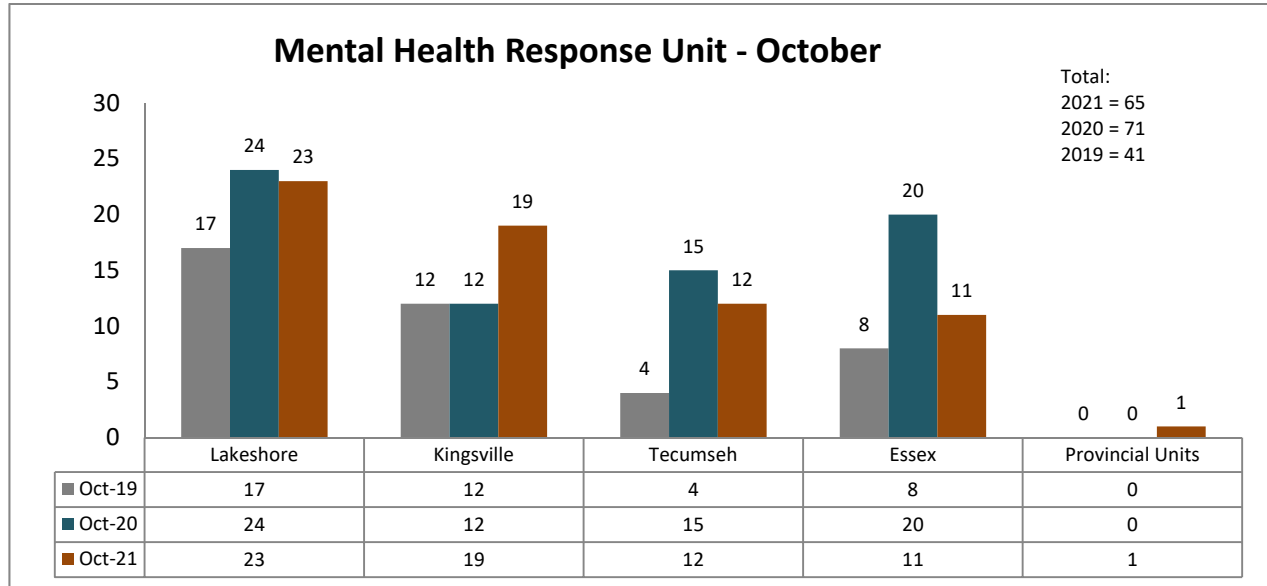
- A **38.3% decrease** in recorded traffic stops in October 2021 compared to October 2020
- An average of **11.4 recorded vehicle stops per day** (compared to 18.5 stops per day October 2020)
- YTD traffic stops are 14.0% lower in 2021 (4,688 stops) compared to 2020 (5,454 stops)

MHRU Calls for Service¹⁴



- An **8.5% decrease** in MHRU calls in October 2021 compared to October 2020
- YTD, MHRU calls are 2.6% lower in 2021 (630 calls) compared to 2020 (647 calls)
- Youth Crisis Response Team (YMCRT) responded to 39 calls for service in October and 283 calls YTD

Notable Investigations

Lakeshore	Members of the Traffic Incident Management Enforcement (TIME) team conducted several days of off-road vehicle enforcement which resulted in numerous interactions with the public and 11 charges under the Off-Road Vehicle Act for Failing to Wear Helmet, No Number Plate, No Permit and Failing to Provide evidence of Insurance.
	An officer responding to a neighbour dispute, investigated the complainant which further revealed sexual assaults by the neighbour who she believed to be a registered massage therapist. Further investigation revealed the male's licence had been suspended with the College of Massage Therapists of Ontario. As a result of the initial investigation, a 59 yr. old male was charged with Mischief and Sexual Assault x3. Following a media release, Major Crime Unit members were contacted by four additional victims which has resulted in additional counts of Sexual Assault.
	Members of the Major Crime Unit, Child Sexual Exploitation Unit and Digital Forensics Unit (DFU) executed a search warrant on a residence after a report by the National Centre for Missing & Exploited Children revealed images and video of child pornography had been uploaded at a local IP address. A 29 yr. old male was charged with Possess Child Pornography x2 and Possess for the Purpose of Publication after an initial review of the devices. A large number of devices were seized and the investigation remains ongoing.
Kingsville	The Community Street Crime Unit (CSCU) executed two simultaneous warrants – one at a residence in Kingsville and the other at a business in Essex after an investigation involving a number of stolen disposal bins from the City of Windsor. As a result of the warrants, 25 large disposal bins were recovered from a variety of sites in Essex and Kent counties with a value of more than \$200,000. A 60 yr. old male and his 37 yr. old son were each charged with numerous counts of Possession of Property Obtained by Crime.
Tecumseh	Officers responded to a Bail Violations call in which a mother called to report her daughter's ex-boyfriend banging on the door of their home while he was already on conditions not to be there. Officers located the 42 yr. old male inside the residence. Investigation provided grounds to arrest that male and further charge him with Assault, Criminal Harassment – repeatedly follow, Mischief, Utter Threats to Cause Death x2, and Fail to Comply with Probation Order x 3
Essex	Officers responded to a violent collision between two motorcycles resulting in serious, life-altering injuries for both operators. Two OPP Reconstructionist investigated and found one of the motorcycles was being operated at an extreme speed into a curved section of the roadway, causing the motorcycle to enter the oncoming lane. A 27 yr. old male being charged with Dangerous Operation Cause Bodily Harm under the Criminal Code as well as Drive While Under Suspension (HTA), Use Plate Not Authorized for Vehicle (HTA) and Operate a Motor Vehicle without Insurance (CAIA).
	The Major Crime unit investigated a Fraud in which the complainant sent \$28,900 in response to an online message that she was the winner of a Workers Compensation Annual Grant. The complainant provided her personal information to the fraudster and was directed to transfer funds into a bank account in order to receive the \$350,000 prize. Production Orders were obtained which identified the accused to be a 69 yr. old female from New Brunswick. RCMP members assisted in making contact with the accused and confirming her identity. A warrant has been obtained for that female.
